CALIFORNIA TRANSPORTATION FOUNDATION By Kathy Freeman

A special note to those of you reading this that are currently working for Caltrans – the **California State Employees Charitable Campaign (CSECC)** is still in progress. Each year the CSECC gives state employees an opportunity to designate automatic monthly paycheck deductions to charities and allows them to give their donation to any IRS approved 501(c)(3) non-affiliate organization eligible to receive tax-deductible contributions such as the California Transportation Foundation. Designating donations to CTF is like keeping it in the family! We hope you will consider a donation

to the Foundation to help CTF continue its work on behalf of all Caltrans employees.

The annual northern CTF Charity Golf Tournament was held in July. The event continues to be a big success with 124 golfers playing along with 28 volunteers working to ensure all went well. Former Caltrans Director and current CTF Board Member Randy Iwasaki served as the Golf Committee cochair this year, helping the event raise close to \$45,000 for the Scholarship and Workers Memorial and Assistance funds. Other former Caltrans Directors Will Kempton, Cindy McKim and Leo Trombatore, and former Agency Secretary Kirk West were all on hand again this year golfing and helping where needed. Our thanks go out to all who participated and especially to those very special volunteers.

During this past quarter, two more Workers Assistance Funds were established. Mr. Rizwan Tanvir, a Senior Transportation Engineer in **District 3 (Resident Engineer on the I-80 HOV** project in Sacramento) and his family suffered a significant financial loss due to a fire and smoke damage to their home. The second Fund was for Mr. John Fox, Senior Transportation Engineer and Chief, Office of Maintenance Engineering in District 9. Mr. Fox was severely injured in a motorcycle accident and admitted to an out-of-state hospital. The Fund was established to help Mr. Fox and his family with the medical and out-of-town living expenses. If you would like to assist either of these families, you may send a check made out to "CTF" with the last name of the individual designated in the memo line and mail it to the California Transportation Foundation, 581 La Sierra Drive, Sacramento, CA 95864.

Funding scholarships with our co-sponsors at Caltrans has been a tradition for CTF. Through July of this year we were able to provide over \$52,000 to students under the following: Haveem Scholarship (Transportation Lab), Buser Scholarship (Land Surveyors), Division of Engineering Services & Architectural Scholarship, Roberts Memorial Scholarship, Civil Engineering Scholarship, Scholarship, Sudhakar Memorial Cowgill Memorial Scholarship (District 8) and to Districts 1, 6/Central Region, 9, 10, and 11. Our thanks to those Caltrans offices, divisions and districts involved this year for their sponsorship and support in this important program. We are currently in the process of raising funds for two very special Children of Fallen Workers scholarships: Scholarship and the Bimla Rhinehart Memorial Scholarship. Nostalgia Trip By Jim Kitchen

Stewardess Jennifer Walker, welcome's me aboard, as I climb the steps into 97"Hotel". I'm about to fly in Otis Spunkmeyer Air, DC-3 Airline's N97H!

I enter the cabin; look up the sloping aisle to the open cockpit door where Captain Bob Campbell and Co-Pilot Candace Harding are completing pre-flight checks. Seating is an executive configuration with single seats on the left, double on the right with lounge seating over the wing. I sit in the last row single seat. Then, Jennifer asks me to move forward to a lounge seat which probably helps with the center of gravity!

Captain Bob comes through the cockpit door, and introduces himself. He introduces Miss Jennifer who passes out hand operated air conditioners. We are sweltering with outside temperature in the triple digits! Our fans say "I am a fan of Otis Spunkmeyer Air!"

As we fan ourselves, Miss Jennifer gives us the run down on N97H. She was delivered to the U.S. Army Air Corps as a C-47B with registration #44-77281 in July 1945. Declared surplus, 97"Hotel" as she's now known, passed through numerous private and corporate owners, until purchased by Otis Spunkmeyer in 1988. N97H has less than 10,000 hours on the airframe, one of the lowest total flight times for D-3's still flying. Based at Oakland International Airport she and a Sister DC-3 fly Nostalgic Sky Tours over the San Francisco Bay area, and appear at air shows. Today, N97H is at the Yuba-Sutter Air Expo, Yuba County Airport, offering sky tours over the Sacramento Valley.

The left propeller turns over as the Pilot commences engine starting. Then, the right engine catches for the sweet sound of twin Pratt & Whitney (P&W) R-1830's radials idling in unison. They release the brakes, and we start down the taxiway towards the South end of the runway.

Cleared for immediate takeoff, we turn onto the active runway, and twin P&W engines roar to life as Captain Bob push the throttles to the wall. We pick up speed, the tail comes up, we speed past air show spectators watching our takeoff, passing over the runway threshold at 250 feet, continuing our climb to 2500 feet where we level out at cruising altitude, and throttle back to 150 mph. We feel cooling outside air and turn off our hand fans!

The Pilot turns off the "Fasten Seat Belt" sign, invites passengers to walk around, and we take turns visiting the cockpit. I look out the window, over the wing to a flat landscape of receding houses, orchards and rice fields beneath us. Miss Jennifer and Stewardess Deana McDade serve complimentary beverages (7up), and start the inflight movie, "Pot of Gold" starring Jimmy Stewart and Shirley Temple.

We circle the Sutter Buttes. Situated in the middle of the Sacramento Valley, the Sutter Buttes rise to over 1500 feet. They're a miniature mountain range complete with foothills. Legend has it that Paul Bunyan was on his way to build the Coast Range with Babe his Blue-Ox pulling a wagon load of dirt when a wheel broke. Paul unloaded some dirt to fix the wheel, and that's how the Sutter Buttes got there!

We continue west to Colusa where we turn south following the Sacramento River. The scenery changes to verdant rice fields, as rice is a major crop around here. Turning towards home, we're cleared for a straight in approach from the South. The "Fasten Seat Belts" sign comes on, so we take our seats for landing. A gentle thump as the wheels touchdown, and we're back on the Yuba County Airport.

We feel the heat again, and start our fans while taxing back to the parking area. The Pilot shuts down the engines, and Jennifer opens the door. As we file out into the hot August afternoon, I overhear another passenger comment: "Now, we're part of History!" AGREED!!

Gish Makes Good, Again!

Public Information Officer Judy Gish, was recently a contributing author in **Roads & Bridges** monthly magazine. The article featured reconstruction of a 9.2 mile portion of the famed I-710 freeway, work by District 7 Engineers, Mid-State Precast and Shimmick/Myers and Sons Joint Venture. Micaiah Revero, Project Manager for SMSJV revealed, "We selected this project because of the precast element. We like to go after work that has some unique value and we saw a competitive advantage here." Mid-State Project Engineer, Safwat Ibrahim, expressed the opinion that "Combining shorter construction duration with the longevity of precise concrete allows for the highway replacement to be costeffective for Caltrans and the taxpayers of California." While building bridges from precast concrete has been used for decades, the decade long effort to reconstruct roadways is now gaining ground, with multiple projects in District 4, District 7 and District 8, not to mention nationally, in Texas,

Missouri, Iowa, Florida, Georgia, Delaware, Utah, The technique is also garnering and Canada. support in Maintenance, where emergency slab repairs have been demonstrated along the I-210 freeway in the past two years. While not the "brainchild" of the strategy, Kirsten Stahl (yours truly), quoted several times in the article, gushes, "this is a natural application" of the technology. "They install quickly, in any weather with no special materials, and can be driven on immediately", a distinct boon to motorists as well as goods movement. "If we have these panels stored at a maintenance yard nearby, we can drop them in and open to traffic an hour later." Deborah Wong, recently promoted to Division Chief of Maintenance has been an active leader in the effort to apply the technology in the field; if a picture is worth a thousand words, recent work by Maintenance featured in the photos, speaks volume.

The Emergency Response

The District Museum is currently hosting a multimedia exhibit on Emergency responses. It is a "must-see" for the visitor to the District Office. Conveniently, a sofa is set in-front of the continuous play video monitor, so you can see the best of emergency response, and hear it live from District responders, such as Zoe Yue, Doug Failing, Amjad Obeid, Alex Perez, and a cast of many other characters.

Mike Miles, recently retired as District 7 Director explained in his farewell remarks, "One of the areas in which Caltrans particularly excels is emergency response. We have so many technical experts and talented people! We currently have an emergency response exhibit in the District 7 museum, which I urge all of you to visit. You will be amazed at the daring, skill and heroism our people have shown in the face of perilous situations."

The exhibit is located at Caltrans District 7 Headquarters at 100 South Main Street, Los Angeles, CA 90012 (across the street from City Hall and LAPD Headquarters), during normal office hours.
