

#### Drink Up, Be Water Wise!

Milly Yamada recently sent a reminder to drink more water and advice on when is the best time to drink water. Her friend, stated, "Well of course if you don't care about your health, then don't bother to read this."

How many folks do you know who say they don't want to drink anything before going to bed because they'll have to get up during the night?? Heart Attack and Water - I never knew all of this!

I asked my Doctor why do people need to urinate so much at night time? Answer from my Cardiac Doctor: Gravity holds water in the lower part of your body when you are standing (legs swell). When you lie down and the lower body (legs, etc.) seeks level with the kidneys, it is then that the kidneys remove the water because it is easier. This ties in with the previous statement! I knew you need your minimum water to help flush the toxins out of your body, but this was news to me.

Correct time to drink water - Very Important, from A Cardiac Specialist! Drinking water at a certain time, maximizes its effectiveness on the body: 2 glasses of water after waking up helps activate internal organs, 1 glass of water 30 minutes before a meal helps digestion, 1 glass of water before taking a bath helps lower blood pressure, 1 glass of water before going to bed - avoids stroke or heart attack.

My Physician told me that water at bed time will also help prevent night time leg cramps. Your leg muscles are seeking hydration when they cramp and wake you up with Charlie Horse.

One more health curiosity, you can tell how well hydrated you are by the color of your urine. The darker it is, the more severely dehydrated you are, so drink UP, and lighten UP! [BTW, dehydration kills many people each day. If you

recall this is what lead to the demise of John and Betty Burris a few years ago.]

A Cardiologist has stated that if each person after receiving this e-mail, sends it to 10 people, probably one life could be saved! I have already shared this information. What about you?

"Life is a one-time gift"!!

#### When It Rains It Pours

Kirsten Stahl writes, "I went in for a before mammogram, and 'breast awareness month' (October) was over I was on an operating table having a lumpectomy. "**Stew** and Dad were in the hospital at the same time", **Kirsten** exclaims! The good news for **Al**, was no heart attack, no stroke, nothing broken, BUT he

had deep vein thrombosis, a condition where inactivity and dehydration causes blood clots in the legs, which can cause a heart attack, stroke or other organ damage. Since he had not been taking his other medications, and now he had to take warfarin, a blood thinner regularly, Kirsten and her sister, Anne, made the tough choice of having him with a 24/7 caregiver, and then move him to assisted living, so he could be in a safer, cleaner environment, and get his meals and meds on time. "Thankfully, Mom and Dad had the foresight to sign-up for long term care insurance in 1995." Hopefully now Al can take advantage of the plan he has paid into all these years, make some new friends, and enjoy the company of his companion dog, "Sammy".

Now we are 1.5 miles from WinCo, and 2 miles from Trader Joe's and 2.5 miles from Kaiser. We moved from 5 acres in the woods to 0.27 of an acre in town. Getting older and moving before we were

forced to. Lots of work here too, but I need something to do.

I appreciated the story by Ray Ruggles in last year's QCCer about Slim Harpham, the rockhound. I knew Slim but didn't realize that he was a rock nut like me. Last year the Imperial Valley Desert Museum let me display some of my rocks in one of their display cases. I only included rocks and fossils that I had found in the Ocotillo area or the nearby desert. Some I collected while working out of town at an asphalt plant at Salton Sea Beach and on the grade and local quarry sites in Winterhaven. I also included rocks from Pinto Mountain which is just across the border in the Ocotillo area. I have asked the Border Patrol if I could cross and collect there now. They said that if I crossed into Mexico near Pinto that I would have to go to a controlled border crossing like at Calexico (about 30 miles) if I wanted to come back to the USA. I first collected at Pinto when I was about 16 years old with the Convair rockhounds. Now I can look out from my backyard in Ocotillo and see Pinto Mountain. - Fleet

[Editor's note: **Dorothy** and **Fleet Palmer** live in Ocotillo, a small community in the Yuha Desert about half way between San Diego and Yuma. For shopping, they travel to El Centro, about 28 miles to the east. They live there in the winter when it is warm during the day. They live in Vancouver, WA in the summer months.]
