major new venture for the QCC is the start of a web-based recruiting effort targeting those who are still working and have reached the 25-year mark in their carrier.

You may be aware that most of our QCC membership is retired with little chance to make contact with those who are still working and who are

candidates for QCC membership. It is rare that there is any significant ceremony for the 25-year award in Districts and even rarer for the local QCC people to be informed and invited to participate. There has been very little recruiting in any District in spite of allowing full reimbursement for any District recruiting costs.

After floating several ideas, we have hired a professional agency to 'broadcast' an email invitation to join the QCC, to the hundreds of working employees who have the 25-years of service. The proposal was reviewed by all QCC District Directors and QCC VPs and got the approval of the majority with no dissension. An even bigger challenge was to get the clearance of the Caltrans HQ IT section for permission to send these hundreds of emails through the state firewall filters. If they were blocked as spam, it would be a big waste of time and money to send them. We still don't have that access working

for us, but do have assurances that as soon as they can work out the glitches, we will be very active in QCC recruiting.

Speaking of costs, yes, it will cost a few hundred dollars each month for this effort. You may have noted in the last edition of the QCC'er that our State treasury has accumulated a significant balance due to the lack of recruiting activity in Districts needing any reimbursement.

You may be familiar with the plan from your days on the job, if the Districts don't make use of funds allocated, HQ will find a way to spend it. I can't guarantee that this effort will be the answer but I've heard of no other option on the table.

Most of the glory behind the QCC is the 'fraternal' nature of enjoying fun time with your co-worker friends in an off-the-job

social event. This new effort falls more in the arena of technical 'web-type' connections, but the younger generations are more into the email, facebook, texting, tweeting and other smart-phone technology. This just might be the means of speaking their language with a social contacts format.

This will be just an "ad-hoc" effort with an anticipated one-year window until we can evaluate whether or not it will produce positive results.

If it works as well as I hope it does, your District has a new need for someone to become the District social media coordinator, keeping tabs on the newer members. How about a Facebook page for each and every QCC District? Do you have your own Facebook page and the talent to get one going for the QCC in your District? What fun times have you and your fellow QCC'ers been doing lately? If interested, contact your District Director.

A very special Senate Concurrent Resolution was approved this year! Caltrans and District 2 in particular lost two of their own in a tragic accident last year—Shawn Baker and Robert Jones. Senate Concurrent Resolution 53 designates two specific portions of I-5 in Siskiyou County as the Shawn Baker and Robert Jones Memorial Highways. This Resolution, while honoring the two employees, includes the mandate requiring the cost to purchase and install memorial signs be from non-state sources. This requirement is true for every memorial section of roadway in the State. In order to assist District 2 in this endeavor, the Foundation has created an account to cover the costs of these memorial signs. The Foundation's premier recognition event, the Transportation Awards Ceremony and Luncheon, was held on May 22nd in Sacramento. This year's prestigious award, Person of the Year, was awarded to former Caltrans Director Will Kempton, Executive Director, Transportation California and former Chief Executive Officer, Orange County Transportation Authority; with the winner of the Elected Official of the Year going to Tom Daly, Assemblymember, California State **Assembly District.** The Organization of the Year Award was presented to San Diego Association of **Governments**: and the *Project of the Year* was for the Caldecott Tunnel 4th Bore. This award was shared by FHWA, CCTA, Alameda County Transportation Commission, MTC. **Caltrans** District 4, Parsons Transportation Group Inc., AECOM. Tudor-Saliba Corp. Special Recognition Award was made to the project for the SFOBB East Span Replacement. Sharing in this award are Caltrans, California Transportation Commission, BATA, T.Y. Lin Int'l/Moffatt & Nichol Joint Venture; American Bridge/Fluor Joint Venture, Kiewit Infrastructure West, Inc., Manson Construction.

The Foundation also congratulates the following Caltrans' managers for their special contributions to the field of transportation and for winning this year's Caltrans Outstanding Management and Engineering in Transportation Awards: Barton Newton. Principle Bridge Engineer won the James E. Roberts Award (registered engineers in the field of transportation structures): Basem Muallem. Director District 8 won the Charles Purcell Award (engineering managers in the field of transportation engineering and transportation program management); Bill Figge, Deputy Director, District 11, Planning Division won the Emerson Rhyner Award (non-engineering managers); and Steve Price, **District Deputy** Director,

Maintenance and Operations, District 5 won the Karl Moskowitz Award (registered engineers in the field of transportation engineering).

Tahoe Celebration

Dale Neumen writes, "This year I started to travel again. The first of February, I drove with my son to Lake Tahoe to celebrate his 60th birthday. My daughter from Auburn has a house there, about a mile from the lake. There were about 12 family members there to celebrate his birthday. Some of them went skiing at Incline. Due to the lack of snow, all the runs were not open, but they still charged \$102 for the lift tickets".

Farther Afield

Dale continues, "On March 16, I flew to Amman, Jordan, using 80,000 frequent flyer miles. Someone was to pick me up at the airport. No one showed up, so I found someone [else] to call a number [that] I had. Someone was to pick me up at midnight - they finally showed up at 1:30 AM. There were no other people on my tour, so I had a private car, private driver, and private guide for five days – A VIP."

"Petra is one of the 'seven wonders of the world', and now I have seen six of them. At Petra, you [see] the treasury temple carved in the red limestone; there were a lot of grave sites carved in the limestone. You walk about three miles through a canyon with walls on both sides, about ten feet wide. Coming back on the walk was a slight incline up, so I had to stop and rest several times."

"Another sight was a Crusader Church built about 1150 AD that was used as a fortress to fight off the Arabs. The Arabs built a castle which was also a fort to fight the Crusaders. We went to Mount Nebu [or Nebo], where Moses spoke to God. They have built a church here in his memory and are adding on to it now. In 100 AD, the Romans built a big city in Jerash. On the main street there are many columns

on both sides. The Roman ruins are one of the best I have seen. They had two theaters here and an Oval Plaza."

"We rode in [the] back of a Toyota pickup for two hours in the desert. It was a very bumpy ride. This was where 'Lawrence of Arabia' was filmed. The highways would have rumble strips about every mile to slow you down. Most of the road signs were triangular in shape with a red border, white background and the message in black. They used some K-rail and also used a yellow stripe on the left and right shoulder[s], and a dashed white stripe in the center. One sign on a two [way] traffic road was a circular sign with red borders showing a red car on the left and a black car on the right."

Dale concludes, "The hotels were first class, one had three pools. The main meat here is chicken, served in most [of] the meals. The prices are about the same as the States for food. Gas is about \$4.50 a gallon."

To Honorary Members

Have you seen this option- **FREE PRINTED COPIES** on the membership renewal form? Many of you have and didn't know exactly what it was for, or thought it was just a free subscription if you checked the box. Well, here is the rest of the story.

If you are at least 80 years of age, you are classified as an Honorary member of the QCC. Being an Honorary member qualifies you for a discounted rate for the printed QCCer, or the electronic version of the QCCer for free (if you have a working email address). These dues rates are less than our cost of producing and sending the QCCer to you, so it's a pretty good deal. The other free option is for Honorary members who cannot afford the \$5 or \$10 rate and do not have a working email account. In other words, paying the dues would be a hardship for them. In this case, the QCC Constitution allows for the free delivery of the printed QCCer, if the Honorary member makes a confidential request to their OCC District Director, and the Director provides written approval. This written approval should be sent to the QCC Secretary/Treasurer.

So, if you think this may apply to you, don't hesitate to contact your QCC District Director. We don't want any QCC members to be left out.
