By the Webmaster

Do you have a story to tell? About your world travels; hobbies; favorite places; life experiences - anything at all? Here's how to get it posted on the Quarter Century Club website:

Write your story in an email and send it to: post+speedreportsjs@coffeecup.com

Your story is then transmitted to the CTQCC website where it is stored in a folder accessible only by the webmaster, who then extracts the text and pictures you sent and stores them in a private folder on the Stories page of the Caltrans District specified by you.

The webmaster then sends you an email with a link to the page containing your story, accessible only by you and the webmaster. You can then view your story on the Internet, make any changes you would like, then send them in an email to post+speedreportsjs@coffeecup.com just as you sent the original.

The webmaster then notifies you by email when the changes have been made.

When you are satisfied with the web page containing your story, send an email to post+speedreportsjs@coffeecup.com authorizing the webmaster to post the story for public viewing.

You can still add to or make changes to the story as described above after it is published by sending an

email to <u>post+speedreportsjs@coffeecup.com</u>. Let us hear from you!

CALIFORNIA TRANSPORTATION FOUNDATION

The California Transportation Foundation (CTF) is again proud to co-sponsor the annual Workers Memorial Ceremony to be held on the west steps of the State Capitol in April 26 at 11 a.m. The ceremony remembers and honors those employees who have lost their lives building, maintaining, and operating California's transportation system with the placement of a wreath at the center of a large diamond of orange cones. Each cone bears the name of one of the 188 Caltrans employees who have been lost. This past year Caltrans lost two of its own: Si Si Han, District 4 Toll Collector, who was struck and killed by a drunk driver when the box truck he was driving crashed into the toll booth where Ms. Han was working and Annette Brooks, District 4 Structural Steel Paint Supervisor who was shot and killed while on the job at the Rio Dell Maintenance Station in District 1. We hope that you will be able to join us at this special ceremony that must be seen to be appreciated. If you are unable to attend the Sacramento ceremony, check with your District Office or the Caltrans' website (www.dot.ca.gov) using the search function for "Workers Memorial" to find the dates of the local tributes. Hope to see you at one of these special tributes.

At last month's Transportation Forum held in Sacramento, 265 members of the transportation community from both the private and public sectors were in attendance. One of the highlights of this premier event was **Caltrans Director Malcolm Dougherty's** farewell address, which

was given a standing ovation. Director Dougherty also gave a shout out to incoming **Director Laurie Berman**, who was also in attendance. During this event, a "live fundraiser" was held and raised \$7,550 to support CTF Scholarships going to students working towards a Master's Degree and a career in transportation.

For those of you that are golf enthusiasts, the California Transportation Foundation's SoCal Charity Golf Tournament is coming up on April 16th. This tournament will be held at the Dove Canyon Golf Club in Orange County. The NorCal Charity Golf Tournament is scheduled for September 24th at the Yocha Dehe Golf Club at the Cache Creek Casino in northern California. These tournaments are a terrific way to have fun with friends and colleagues while supporting our Proceeds from the transportation community. tournaments support CTF Programs such as Scholarship Grants for transportation students, Memorial & Assistance Grants for workers killed or injured on the job, Career Development Grants for new transportation professionals and so much more.
