Earlier this year Mr. Broderick Carmichael, an Electrician II was presented the Special Service Award (Silver) Medal of Valor for his actions on March 26, 2017 at approximately 11 a.m. when he and his colleague were replacing a damaged traffic signal at a busy intersection in Hermosa Beach. As they were completing their work and waiting to cross the street, they heard a loud crash as two cars Carmichael was facing collided Mr. the intersection, while his colleague had her back to the treacherous scene that was rapidly unfolding behind her. She could not see that the impact propelled one of the vehicles into a chaotic spin toward the very spot where she was standing. Instead of quickly getting himself out of harm's way, his instinct was to protect her at all costs. The car jumped the curb, and Mr. Carmichael lunged for her. Although the car struck her, he was able to pull her to safety. She fell into his arms, unresponsive and dazed by the impact. The car came to rest in the median, in the same spot where she stood waiting to cross moments before. He helped her up and guided her to their work truck, catching her as she fainted on the way and called 911. She suffered injuries to her hip and foot, however, without Mr. Carmichael's heroic intervention, her injuries would likely have been far worse. With no regard for his own safety, **Mr. Carmichael** went above and beyond the call of duty. The State of California takes great pride in presenting the Silver Medal of Valor to California Department of Transportation Electrician Broderick Carmichael. Congratulations!

The Foundation has established the **David** Langston Memorial Fund in memory of Mr. David Langston, a District 3 worker who died while providing training for the Human Resources employees. CTF is matching donations dollar for dollar. To support his family during this difficult time, donations may be made on line at www.transportationfoundation.org/donate.

That trip had to be canceled after his lady friend and travel companion broke her ankle while they were visiting in Utah in April 2018. So, the planned Tour was rescheduled for July 2019. And then, along came a special offer on a June 2019 Baltic Sea Cruise with Viking Cruises, so they schedule that also. As it turned out, there was a week between the cruise and the tour. They decided to do some independent travel for

that week. This ended up being a 5-week-long adventure in Europe.

The cruise began in Bergen, Norway and ended in Stockholm, Sweden. The station is in a tunnel at the top of the mountain. This train tunnel was used in a final scene of the Clint Eastwood movie "The Eiger Sanction." From that station they walked through an amazing series of tunnels to access a complex that includes restaurants, observation decks, a post office, elevators and moving walkways. There are even tunnels through the glacier. Traversing the glacier tunnel led them to a reception in The Ice Palace, a room carved into the glacier itself, where they had snacks and drinks. Walking of the ice floor took some getting used to.

The Tour also took them to the Lakes District of Italy where they visited Lakes Lugano and Como. Returning to Switzerland the Tour ended in Luzern. All of the hotels on the Tour were fabulous, as were the meals.
