The crews, about 30 plus people or so, were dismissed. And then the magic happened. Few, if any of those in attendance left. They formed a line and wrote on the card and gave money. Outside the hallway, one electrician who didn't attend the meeting joked that he thought people were picking squares for the Super Bowl pool to be held that weekend. It was an incredible display of love and affection by individuals who did not know the person, but they knew that she was one of ours and needed help. Those moments after that safety meeting, all the love that was shown, will stay with me for the rest of my life. Hence, the title above, 'The Great People at Caltrans.' Love ya!
