You can then view your story on the Internet, make any changes you would like, then send them in an email to post+speedreportsjs@coffeecup.com just as you sent the original.

The webmaster then notifies you by email when the changes have been made. When you are satisfied with the web page containing your story, send an email to post+speedreportsjs@coffeecup.com

authorizing the webmaster to post the story for public viewing. You can still add to or make changes to the story as described above after it is published by sending an email to <u>post+speedreportsjs@coffeecup.com</u>. Let us hear from you!



The following are some notes from Dorothy's life in District 3, as recorded in the *District 3 Update 3, Issue 214*, dated January 15, 1996:

**Dorothy Leeper**: January 19 (1996) is the last day for Materials & Stores Specialist Dorothy Leeper. **Dorothy** started as an Intermediate Clerk in Accounting. In 1971 she went to the Woodland Maintenance Office. The lure of the great outdoors and, of course, more money, led Dorothy to become a Maintenance "Man" at the Dunnigan Rest Area in 1973.

She later returned to the office in the Permits trailer in 1974 for about a year, returning to the field as a Landscape Maintenance Worker at Roseville Landscape in 1975. Back again to the office in 1979 for a six-month stint in the mailroom. Dorothy left state service for a year to go to Oregon but returned in 1981 to Roseville Landscape. From there she went to the temporary spray crew in 1982 and then to the stencil crew for a traveling job until 1989.

It was then **Dorothy** decided it was time for a 40hour week and came into Procurement as a Materials and Stores Specialist. This job fit the bill for Dorothy because she is not "stuck behind a desk all day." Dorothy said she enjoyed her career, returning to Maintenance three times. One half of her 28+ year career, with the state has been in Maintenance. Thank you, **Dorothy** for your story with District 3.

#### I Wish I Could Go Back in Time By Gordon Analla

The exact date I don't remember. The year, approximate Spring of 2002. This was after my career seeing multiple fatalities which saw Caltrans employees and those working off their debt to society killed out on the state's right of way. It was a free seminar, touching on new techniques of safety and equipment. The location was in a motel, with a ball room setting, in Hayward. There must have been over 200 people in attendance. Amazing what a free seminar and lunch can do to draw people.

I checked in and received my name tag. I sat on the side of the room, about a third of the way back. The instructor started the seminar. Approximately an hour or so into it, he made a comment about Caltrans workers being lazy. He received a pretty good chuckle from those in attendance. I didn't laugh. It was not a funny subject. I knew better. A short time later, there was a brief intermission. This was my chance to set this guy straight. I went up to him at the break as I did so breathing steady in and out on my way to his podium. I had to tell myself that I was a representative of the agency and I had to conduct myself with a degree of professionalism (unlike him). I stated my case that I would hope he would refrain from poking fun at Caltrans workers, especially those out in the field. As many had given their lives in the line of duty. And that working out on the highways and bridges was very dangerous work. He seemed surprised by my forthright attitude. And I was led to believe he would honor my request. I was satisfied. I was wrong.

I went back to my table and talked with a woman seated there who understood where I was coming from. She was a nice lady. Soon after the seminar continued. We were maybe into it about ten minutes after the break and then the unbelievable happened. This pretentious --------, went right back at making fun of Caltrans workers. I could feel my blood pressure rise. I looked at the lady that I had spoken with, nodded at her, and then rose to leave. I walked out the side door and that was it. Looking back, I shouldn't have just left. Oh no. Damn the torpedoes as it were. I should have stood up and raised the issue with the instructor. I should have told him in front of all, that he was wrong to make fun of Caltrans workers. I should have told him in front of all, of the lives that were lost, and the one's that I was involved with. I should have told him how very dangerous it is to work out on the highways and bridges, tunnels and tubes, and roads where high-speed travel prevails. Where inattention is all too frequent. I should have told him of all the times Caltrans workers answer the call, day or night, good weather or bad, holidays, and weekends to make the roadways safer for the motoring public to travel. I should have told him how impactful the loss of a loved one is when one is committed to this task. I should have told him, that the workers risk their lives each day. I should have told him and all those in attendance all that and more. But I didn't.

If God would ever grant me the wish to do so, I would go back in a minute and do all the above. I only hope someday that I can. Until then . . . I am sorry for all of you dedicated highway workers that I didn't speak up and out for you that day. It is something I always will regret until I can make it right.---

Caltrans District 5 has several projects in the works. An unusual one is a mitigation project off the highway in Paso Robles. The work includes restoration of four acres around Centennial Creek, to improve hydrology and function of the creek. The project will offset the impact to wetlands caused by the widening of Hwy 46 East. The next phase around the Cholame Y will begin in Fall 2022.

A roundabout will be constructed near Hollister at the Hwy 25/156 intersection, to improve safety and reduce the number of accidents on the 156 truck corridor. Construction is scheduled to start around January.

A current project began August 23 on Hwy 1 near Limekiln State Park, involving replacement of a large culvert. There will be one-way traffic control with delays of 10-15 minutes. Completion is expected at the end of November.

Sorry to say, I don't have a lot of news this time. I did attend a retirement get-together for **Steve Cadenasso**, who retired from Traffic. Several D-5 employees and retirees met on a sunny afternoon at a brew pub which opened near the District Office on Higuera St. You may remember the building as a motorcycle shop, antique store, or a wholesale food distributor. Twenty-four members and guests had a very nice time visiting and catching up since the pandemic began in March, 2020, and also enjoyed the delicious lunch.

Those in attendance were LaVerne Archie, one of our newest members, Michael & Paula Beauchamp, Gerald & Judie Brown, Donna Rodriguez, a guest who joined QCC that day, Wanda Gernux, Bill Feenstra, Janice Feenstra, Judi Hudgens, also a new member, Stan & Ina Lisiewicz, Marsha Lotze, Andy Machen, Jim & Linda Miller, Mark & Laurie Pertile, Sybille Phillips, and her guests Fred & Beverly Rios, who joined QCC that day also, (Fred is from our Maintenance Branch), Tom Powell, Linda Supernaw and Priscilla Williams. Our retired State Director, Butch Biendara sent us a Division of Highways watch for a door prize and Laurie Pertile was the lucky winner. Congratulations to Laurie and all our members that were able and attended the Luncheon.

Our District Director, **Mike Beauchamp**, spoke to the group on the happenings in District 8 and also on statewide issues. Our President, **Sybille Phillips**, wrote up the notes as follows:

Re Diversity Day and Employee Appreciation Day, he expects a statewide decision in August whether to hold in-person events. If yes, District 8 Quarter Century Club may be featured on the kiosk in the lobby and on the District 8 website!

At the start of the pandemic, 700 District 8 workers were approved for telework, and statewide 12,000. Critical employees in Construction, Maintenance Center (TMC) etc. could not telework. Now that there is a reopening, most employees have three choices:

- 1. Full Telework includes 1 day in the office
- 2. Non-Teleworker but includes 1 day out of the office
- 3. Hybrid but includes 2 days out of the office

12,000 laptops were purchased, and meetings conducted using the Webex platform. One day **Mike** had 12 Webex meetings – very exhausting!

Caltrans is hiring and has 130 Civil Engineers on rotation! Our Maintenance crews were working every day during the pandemic.

Unfortunately, District 8 lost **Bob Schross**, Maintenance, to Covid. He was in his early 60's and did not believe in Covid. His wife placed a vivid memorial on U-Tube, urging everyone to get vaccinated. A 50-year old in Construction died of Covid leaving behind two young children...

Current projects in Construction - \$1.3 billion and a \$200 million Design build on Interstate 10, plus a \$130 billion project going to bid in August north of Cajon.

Next year Interstate 10 will see a "White Topping" project from Indio to Blythe, "White Topping" is 1/10 skin of asphalt concrete (AC), a thin leveling course, and 12-13" of Portland Cement Concrete (PCC). 50% of the traffic is trucks!

The District also developed a 10-year Asset Management Plan which the District Director has to sign. It includes \$430 million in projects/year.

One of the values of the new D8 Strategic Plan is "Pride". **Jim Rogers**, Maintenance Superintendent, stated "Why would we not let everyone know that we take pride in our work"?

Our Caltrans Director, **"Toks" Omishakin**, strives for Excellence and told **Mike** "D8 is great"!

The "Clean California" program which includes litter removal and beautification, is \$1 billion/year. 1/3 goes to the locals, 2/3 to the State.

Homelessness is a BIG issue.

Caltrans in multimodal – pedestrians, rail, bikes, and buses. The focus is shifting from moving vehicles to moving people. A privately funded company, Brightline West (formerly known as XpressWest), is working on a high speed rail line from Apple Valley to Las Vegas and Apple Valley to Rancho Cucamonga.

Mike then answered many questions. LaVerne Archie asked about the homeless. Mike explained that CT lost the inmate services due to the pandemic, homeless camps include hazardous waste – needles, drugs, etc., requiring HAZMAT services, and Caltrans must work with the locals so the homeless do not move right back. Funding is a big issue. Veterans can be helped the fastest because there are many wrap around services for them.

**Mike** worked on a 4-month assignment in District 7 where Los Angeles passed a \$1 billion bond to lease Caltrans land for bridge housing for the homeless.

If homeless camps are a safety issue – e.g. causing fires, etc., then CHP or Sheriff's can remove them immediately.

**LaVerne**, 909-936-9940 (texts ok), volunteered to be the contact if members want to meet for an informal lunch every 2 months or so. Let her know! Thank you LaVerne!

Here's some good news to report about our member Linda Wilford from her and Diana Barich...She had a partial nephrectomy of her left kidney in July. Her surgeon was extremely happy with her progress and numbers. Her numbers have returned to where they were presurgery and in a couple of cases have even improved over where they were...great news! Although the mass which was removed from her left kidney was found to be cancerous, the surgeon is confident that they were able to get all of it because the edges were "clear'...more good news. So no chemo or radiation. Since she had no external staples or stitches (they used glue and internal stitches), she doesn't need any further follow-up until early next year. She was reminded that healing will take time. She is on restricted "light duty" for the next 5-7 weeks and she was advised that her energy level will probably take another 6 months.

**Linda** can now do light duty activities and has begun walking with her group again. It's only two miles and it takes her twice as long as it used to but she can do it. She is looking forward to seeing everyone at our holiday luncheon. Thank you to all who kept **Carol** company, via the telephone while she waited nervously at the hospital, to those who sent cards, plants, flowers, balloons, gifts, text, emails and prayers. Linda is sure they have helped make her recovery happen faster, and thanks to our neighbors T&T for having their 4<sup>th</sup> of July BBQ with Carol while she kept me fed with jello and soup broth. She feels so blessed to be surrounded by such wonderful friends and family. Thanks Again, **Linda**.
